NEW HOMEOWNERS NEEDING AMENITY CARDS

Welcome to Riverstone! To have amenity cards made for you, please email us the following:

1. Completed amenity card form (found at www.riverstone.com)
2. Deed or closing disclosure

3. Individual headshot pictures of each resident over the age of 5. Please label each photo with their name and date of birth.

4. Proof of identification (State ID, Driver's License, passport, etc) for all residents over the age of 18.

5. Anyone over the age of 18 whose name is not listed on the deed will need to provide additional proof of residence. Examples of acceptable Proof of Residency may include car insurance, utility bill, cell phone bill, etc. and must include the resident's name and current home address.

Each account will receive up to 3 adult amenity cards and at no charge. Each additional adult amenity card after the first 3 cards is \$15.00.

REPLACING A LOST AMENITY CARD

The replacement of lost Amenity Cards is available for \$15 each.

If you need a replacement Amenity Card, please complete the credit card form found on our website (www.riverstone.com) and email it to us at customercare@riverstone.com. Please also include your home address and a headshot picture labeled with your name and date of birth.

Riverstone HOA Board of Directors Election Candidates

Dear Riverstone Homeowners,

As we move forward into an exciting new phase for our community, we want to inform you about important changes regarding the governance of the Riverstone Homeowners Association. The Johnson Development Corporation will soon transition out of its role on the HOA Board, marking a significant shift toward a resident-elected Board. This transition is a direct result of the Johnson Development's ownership entities transferring title of all sellable property within Riverstone's boundaries, ensuring that all Board members will be property owners in good standing within our community.

This transition allows homeowners like you to have a direct role in electing representatives who will serve your interests. The current Board recently passed a resolution to expand from 3 to 5 Board members, as allowed in the association's Bylaws. This means that residents' votes will now count towards electing five new Board members.

The primary role of the board, with assistance from our staff, is to oversee the business of the association and plan for the future. This includes, among other things, approving annual budgets, developing policies, adopting resolutions, awarding contracts for services, approving capital expenditures, hearing homeowners'

appeals on deed restriction violation issues, making decisions involving collection and legal matters, and guiding our staff. Board members are entrusted to make major decisions that affect the greater good of the community in all respects.

Election Details:

The Riverstone HOA Board will be transitioning to resident-elected positions. The upcoming election will determine five new Board members, who will serve staggered terms based on the number of votes received.

A third-party company will handle the voting process and tabulate the results to ensure a fair and transparent election. Neither the HOA Board nor Management will be involved in the vote verification or counting process.

The election is open until November 18, 2024, with voting closing at 5:00 p.m. that day.

This is your chance to make a meaningful impact on the future of Riverstone, and we encourage all homeowners to participate in the process!

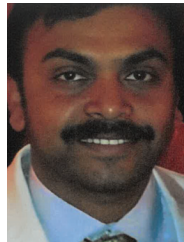

- Riverstone Rec Center Playground (4515 Riverstone Blvd): The play area received a major upgrade with brand-new playset equipment, bringing fresh energy and fun to the space.
- Avalon Park (6030 ½ McAlister Falls Dr): We've enhanced the sand and stepping log areas and are currently awaiting replacements for the imaginary play components to elevate the interactive experience further.
- Big Adventure Park (18353 University Blvd): The pour-in-place walkways have been ordered and are scheduled for installation before the end of the year. In addition, we've begun refreshing the playground's landscaping, adding more trees and plants to create

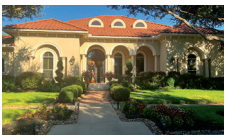
a vibrant, welcoming atmosphere. Once the pour-in-place is completed, the remaining landscaping work will be finalized.

Non-Profit Spotlight



Preparing students for the future is the job of Elkins High School. Preparing students to become future leaders and entrepreneurs is the job of Distributive Education Clubs of America (DECA), a non-profit organization that helps high school and college students develop business skills, leadership and career readiness.

There are 258,082 members in DECA worldwide. At Elkins High School, there are 177 members, said Eshal Momin, 2024-25 DECA president for Elkins High School

“DECA helps create future leaders and entrepreneurs by providing hands-on experiences through competitions and real-world simulations,” Momin said. “It emphasizes skill development in areas like hospitality, marketing, entrepreneurship and finance while providing networking opportunities with industry professionals.”

The DECA program offers students valuable insight into the business world, helping them develop essential marketing and entrepreneurship skills. It also provides hands-on experience that prepares them for real-world challenges and opportunities in their future careers.

To join, students are required to be in a CTE (Career and Technical Education) course. Students who are especially interested in a business career take a pathway of courses, including Principles of Business, Marketing and Finance, Business Information Management, Accounting, and Securities and Investments.

Students also choose a competitive event for the year and attend workshops related to it. The events are grouped into three categories—role-plays and case studies, prepared events and online simulations. Within those categories there are options in each of the four career clusters—marketing, finance, hospitality and management—as well as entrepreneurship and personal financial literacy.

“Students will compete at a Houston area-wide competition,” Momin said. “Top competitors will move on to the state competition in Dallas. We are hoping to have several top competitors in Dallas who will move on to compete at the International Career Development Conference in Orlando, Florida.”

Another important aspect of the program is the School Business Enterprise, in this instance a concession stand that sells cookies and slushies during lunches on Fridays.

“The concession stand is run by students who are learning valuable business skills about food safety, customer service, finance and more,” Momin said. “All monies made help our program grow.

Students also gain valuable skills when they are preparing for and competing in their events. Students in DECA gain skills in problem solving, communication and teamwork.

Knowledge is nothing without heart, and DECA students are required to participate in community and school service activities, such as Lunches of Love activity held in October. Then, Elkins DECA decorated lunch bags for the program so that children receiving the lunches have a visual treat.

An advantage many high school DECA programs have is the help and experience provided by local businesses. Elkins DECA is always looking for partners.

“Professional members can provide a variety of support, including speaking to our members about their companies and careers, offering a tour or visit to their business, and/or judging at our district competition in January,” said Momin. “Professional members can also provide financial support for our chapter activities. In return, we can advertise those businesses on our campus and on t-shirts for our members.”

The DECA program is invaluable for helping students interested in careers in business achieve their goals, providing them with the hands-on experience they need to succeed.

“Elkins DECA is a growing organization, and we’re proud to represent our school and community as we interact with professionals in the business world,” Momin said.

SPICY BLACK BEAN & PUMPKIN SOUP—READY FOR WINTER!

Notes from Lindsay's kitchen: Over the last decade I've recreated an online recipe into this easy and healthy vegetarian soup perfect for the fall and winter. The great thing about soups is you adjust it to your favorite flavors and consistency. I love spicy foods, so I add many chipotle peppers. I usually make this recipe in the crockpot, it can also be made stovetop. Consider every ingredient amount approximate, add more or add less of any ingredient to make the best flavor for you and your family.

2 tbsp extra virgin olive oil (if using stovetop or InstantPot)	2 tbs adobo sauce
1 small yellow onion (approx. 1 cup), finely chopped	1 tbsp ground cumin
4 garlic cloves, finely minced	¼tsp cayenne pepper
1 chipotle pepper in adobo sauce, seeded and chopped	3 cans black beans
	1 can fire roasted tomatoes
	1 can pumpkin puree
	Broth/water for desired consistency

Crockpot/InstantPot recipe:

1. If you're using an InstantPot, you have the option to sauté the onions in olive oil first. If you don't have time for this step or are using a crockpot, move to step 2.
2. Seed the chipotle pepper(s) and chop into pieces. Chop onion and mince garlic.
3. Add onion, chipotle pepper(s), adobo sauce, black beans, tomatoes, pumpkin and spices to pot.
4. Stir and slow cook for 4-8 hours, depending on your appliance's settings. Add broth or water as needed.

Cooktop Instructions:

1. Sauté onions until soft and translucent.
2. Follow above steps, adding all ingredients and spices.
3. Simmer for 30+ minutes (or more), stirring occasionally, add broth or water as needed.

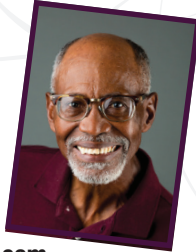

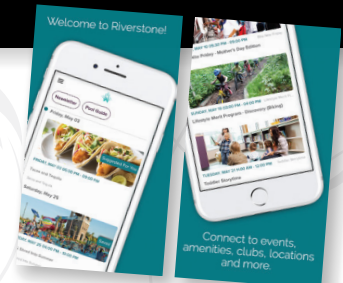
