- 3. Individual headshot pictures of each resident over the age of 5. Please label each photo with their name and date of birth.
- 4. Proof of identification (State ID, Driver's License, passport, etc) for all residents over the age of 18.
- 5. Anyone over the age of 18 whose name is not listed on the deed will need to provide additional proof of residence. Examples of acceptable Proof of Residency may include car insurance, utility bill, cell phone bill, etc. and must include the resident's name and current home address.

Each account will receive up to 3 adult amenity cards and at no charge. Each additional adult amenity card after the first 3 cards is \$15.00.

REPLACING A LOST AMENITY CARD

The replacement of lost Amenity Cards is available for \$15 each.

Nominations Are Now Open for the Riverstone HOA Board of Directors

Riverstone Homeowners Association, Inc.'s Board of Directors, is currently seeking individuals who would be interested in running for the Board. Below, we have compiled a list of some frequently asked questions regarding the Board and election process.

Why is there an election for the Board?

Since the JDC ownership entities have transferred title of all sellable property within the boundaries of Riverstone, the Board will be filled with property owners in good standing within the association.

What are the responsibilities of the Board?

The primary role of the board, with assistance from our staff, is to oversee the business of the association and plan for the future. This includes, among other things, approving annual budgets, developing policies, adopting resolutions, awarding contracts for services, approving capital expenditures, hearing homeowners' appeals on deed restriction violation issues, making decisions involving collection and legal matters, and guiding, our staff. Board members are entrusted to make major decisions that affect the greater good of the community in all respects.

Do I have time for this?

As a board member, you'll need to devote 10-12 hours per quarter to the Association (perhaps more if you serve as an officer of the association).

Who serves on the Board?

The Riverstone HOA Board will begin the transition to resident-elected Board positions.

How long is a Board member's term?

The newly elected Board members will serve staggered terms. Members must elect one director for a term of

one year, one director for a term of two years, and one director for a term of three years.

How are winners determined?

The quorum requirement is 10% of eligible Members. Once the quorum is reached, the candidate receiving the highest number of votes will serve a 3-year term, the candidate receiving the second highest number of votes will serve a 2-year term, and the candidate receiving the third highest number of votes will serve a 3-year term. At or before annual meetings thereafter, the Members will elect directors for 3-year terms.

Who tabulates the votes?

In addition to handling the voting process, a third-party company will tabulate the results to maintain the integrity of the voting. No one from the Riverstone HOA Board or Management will be involved in verifying and tabulating the votes.

Nomination forms will not be accepted after 5:00 p.m. on Friday, October 11th, 2024.

One of the most common deed restriction violations that the Riverstone compliance department sends out is for tree maintenance and tree trimming. Tree trimming, often seen as a routine maintenance task, plays a crucial role in ensuring the health and beauty of your landscape. Here's a closer look at why tree trimming is more than just a cosmetic enhancement.

Promotes Tree Health

One of the primary benefits of tree trimming is the promotion of overall tree health. By removing dead, diseased, or damaged branches, you prevent the spread of pests and pathogens. Trimming helps the tree focus its energy on producing new, healthy growth, which can strengthen its immune system. Additionally, proper pruning improves air circulation and sunlight penetration, reducing the likelihood of fungal infections and promoting better growth.

Enhances Aesthetic Appeal

A well-maintained tree can significantly enhance the visual appeal of your landscape. Trimming helps shape trees to complement the overall design of your garden, creating a balanced and harmonious look. Whether it's for manicured hedges, well-defined canopies, or simply a cleaner appearance, tree trimming contributes to a polished and attractive yard.

Prevents Overgrowth Issues

Unchecked tree growth can lead to several issues, including interference with utility lines, obstructing sidewalks or the street, and even damaging nearby structures. Regular trimming keeps trees within manageable limits, preventing them from encroaching on power lines, roofs, and other important areas. This proactive approach helps maintain functionality and aesthetics around your property.

You are also within your right to trim any tree limbs growing over your property up to the property line (fence and brick wall) without needing prior ARC or HOA approval, so long as it does not kill the tree.

Property owners can trim overhanging tree branches within these guidelines:

- The tree can only be trimmed to the property line.
- The tree must not be trimmed to such an extent as to damage or harm the tree's health.
- There is no right to trespass upon a neighbor's property to trim a tree.
- The cost of trimming is borne by the neighbor who is trimming the tree.

Please note that according to the Texas State property code, a person is not under an affirmative duty to prune or trim a healthy tree when its branches extend over his neighbor's property, even if the tree branches extend over the neighbor's roof or driveway where cars are parked.

Supports Structural Integrity

Tree trimming can improve the structural integrity of a tree by removing weak or poorly attached branches that could pose a risk of breaking. By selectively pruning these areas, you help the tree develop a more balanced and sturdy structure, which can withstand harsh weather conditions better and reduce the likelihood of limb failure.

Facilitates Easier Maintenance

Finally, regular trimming can simplify ongoing maintenance tasks. Trees that are well-pruned are easier to manage and require less intensive care in the long run. Keeping branches away from structures and pathways also reduces the amount of debris and potential cleanup needed after storms or high winds.

Tree trimming is more than just an aesthetic choice—it's a crucial aspect of maintaining the health of the tree(s). By investing time and effort into regular pruning, you ensure that your trees remain vibrant and functional, contributing positively to your landscape and overall property value. Whether you're looking to enhance curb appeal or promote healthy growth, tree trimming offers a range of benefits that make it a wise and rewarding practice.

Tennis Court Etiquette

- Talk quietly when standing near tennis courts that are in use so as not to disrupt players on adjacent courts.
- Never walk behind a court when a point is still in play. Wait until the point is over and then cross as fast as possible to get to your own court.
- When sending balls back to a neighboring court, roll them on to the back of the court.
- Never send them back while play is in progress. Also, if one of your balls rolls into an
 adjacent court, don't run after it, just wait for your neighboring court to return the ball
 when it's convenient.
- When reserving courts please be considerate to other residents by cancelling your reservation when you know that you will not be using it.

Tennis Court Reminders

- Please remember all tennis court reservations are now available through the Riverstone app only.
- Remember that court reservations will be forfeited after 15 minutes of not showing up for scheduled start time.
- Tennis courts are for the use of tennis or pickleball play only. Any other sports or equipment are strictly prohibited. For more information refer to rule #4 at the Resource Center under Community Info.
